Stage 1: po

Edward de Bono coined the word "po," meaning "provocation operation."

There are various ways to develop provocations, including:

* Escape: spell out something we take for granted, then cancel or negate it.

Example: We take for granted that consumption causes pollution.

Po, consumption reduces pollution.

Example: We take for granted that we can buy food.

Po, we cannot buy food.

* **Reversal:** take the usual way something is done and reverse it.

For example, I enjoy wilderness. Po, the wilderness enjoys me.

For example, Parents decide to have children. Po, children decide to have parents.

* Exaggeration

Example: Po, stratospheric ozone has disappeared.

Example: Po, there are endless reserves of fossil fuels.

* Distortion

Example: Po, pollution in the future affects people now.

Example: Po, politicans vote to select their electorates.

* Wishful thinking

Example: Po, I can consume all I like without harming the environment.

Example: Po, Buildings construct themselves.

Stage 2: applying po

- 1. Write down at least 15 provocations related to limits to growth.
- 2. Pick three of these provocations for development. Work out how they might actually work. (This is likely to involve doing things very differently!)
- 3. Figure out how these three provocations relate to a theory (your choice).
- 4. Write your results (15 provocations, three of which are elaborated and related your theory) on an A3 sheet with your names.
- 5. Prepare a skit lasting about 90 seconds illustrating and explaining one provocation.
