YOUR ARTICLE ON DR. M.E. SPAUTZ

Thank you for your courtesy in sending with your letter of 2 July copy of your draft article concerning Dr. Spautz.

I will send copy of the article to the Vice Chancellor of the University of Newcastle and will leave it to him to decide whether it should be distributed.

I do not have the time just now to read the article carefully. However, my failure to comment on it should not be taken as acceding to some of the statementsin it. Amongst those which have caught my eye, I do not agree, in particular, with the inference on page 24 that undue emphasis was given in this matter to order and insufficient to due process. Furthermore, you appear to have overlooked the fact that the University of Newcastle did not ignore Dr. Spautz' complaint of plagarism. Amongst other things, it suggested that such a complaint was more properly directed to the university which granted the degree complained about, namely the University of Western Australia. As I understand it, that university has rejected Dr. Spautz' complaint.

There are many other points in your paper with which I would beg to differ. However, as Dr. Spautz continues to threaten legal action, I suppose it is best to leave the matter for a time as it may have to be debated in court. You will have realised from reading the committee's report that we were greatly saddened by the case as it was unfolded before the committee.
